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- **What Is a Community Health Needs Assessment?**

A Community Health Needs Assessment, or CHNA, is a way for communities to take a closer look at their overall health. It involves gathering information about things like common health conditions, access to healthcare, and the social and environmental factors that affect people's well-being. Community members, local organizations, and healthcare providers all play a role in identifying what's working well and where improvements are needed.

- **Why It Matters**

CHNAs are important because they help communities focus their efforts on the issues that matter most. By understanding local health challenges and strengths, leaders can make better decisions about where to invest time and resources. The process also encourages collaboration between hospitals, public health agencies, and community groups—so together, they can create programs and policies that make the community healthier and stronger.

- This report presents the main findings from the primary analysis of our Community Health Needs Assessment, which gathered input directly from members of the local community via a paper or online survey (see Appendix A). It also includes a review of secondary data from across the county to provide a broader picture of local health trends and challenges.

- **Survey Process and Overview**

The University of Nevada, Reno Office of Statewide Initiatives provided technical support to Mount Grant General Hospital in developing the Community Health Needs Assessment. This included creating the survey tool, recommending outreach strategies such as online promotion and community engagement, and producing both online and paper versions of the survey, which was open for eight weeks. Secondary health data was gathered from the County Health Rankings and Intellimed International Database, and survey responses were analyzed to identify key community health needs. The following is general data about the survey timeline and response.

- **Launched:** September 2, 2025
- **Closed:** October 26, 2025
- **233 Responses:** [33 Paper surveys, 200 Online surveys]
- **Average time taken to complete survey online:** 3 hours and 15 minutes
- **Median time taken to complete the survey online:** 12 minutes

- **Range of time to take the online survey:** 4 minutes to 240 hours and 3 minutes





Mineral County Population Health and Well-being - 2025











11. Percentage of Ninth-Grade Cohort that Graduates in Four Years in Mineral County, NV





14. Top 10 Current and Projected 5-Year Conditions by Diagnostic Category in Mineral County, NV - 2025



